Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday we began the season of **Lent** with Ash Wednesday liturgies. We marked our foreheads with ashes as a reminder of our humanness and that sometimes we fail and need God's help to succeed. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving for the forty days leading up to Easter. As the children learn more about Lent at school, I encourage you to ask questions of your children and have some interesting dinner time discussions about our faith journey to Easter.

Next week we celebrate **Catholic Schools Week**. CSW is a time to recognise the great things that happen in Catholic

schools. The theme for 2020 is "Drawing from the well. Invitation, Encounter, Witness". This acknowledges that Jesus Christ is always at the heart of everything we do. Recognising this is the foundation of a Catholic school education, the lens through which everything is viewed, and the belief that informs all policies and decisions.

"Invitation, Encounter, Witness" celebrates the connection of the school community with Jesus Christ. Our students are invited to the well, where, with Jesus as their guide they encounter diversity of learning in a supportive and inclusive environment, and witness service to others and the community.

We will hold an **Open Day** (new families welcome!) on Friday 6th March starting with a Liturgy in the Roger Kennedy Centre at 8.45am followed by open classrooms until 10.30am.

Catholic Schools Week marks the beginning of our enrolment period for 2021 Kindergarten enrolments. On Wednesday 11th March we will hold a **Kinder 2021 Information Evening** at 6pm in the library. This evening is for new

families, though current families are most welcome. If you know of new families interesting in joining the St Paul's family in 2021, please let them know about these events.

Parent-Student-Teacher Meetings have been taking place this week. These are very important meetings in building the partnership between school and home. Together parents, children and teachers have been setting learning goals for the year. It is only by working together that we can achieve the best outcomes for our children. If you missed your PST Meeting this week, please contact your child's teacher as soon as possible.

This year our school is in a **review year**. The purpose of the review is for the school to reflect on its practice and identify areas for improvement and to stimulate action to ensure this happens. As part of the review process we will be seeking feedback from our community – parents/carers, staff, students and clergy. An online parent/carer survey will be sent to parents shortly via email. We would be most grateful if you could complete this survey (it only takes about 10 mins!). The online survey is administered by an independent organisation, the University of Newcastle's Faculty of Education. Your responses will be treated confidentially and your privacy respected. The more surveys completed, the greater the feedback received which will inform our future journey towards school improvement at St Paul's.

Some parents have very kindly contacted me about supporting the P&F and wanting to know more about the executive roles. Our next **P&F Meeting** is next Wednesday 4th March at 6.30pm in the library. I have asked them to attend next week's meeting to see if we can form an executive committee; we will need at least a President, Secretary and Treasurer. Please join us if you can as we work together for the benefit of our children.

ST MARY'S ENROLMENT PROCESS FOR YEAR 7 2021

Students who are applying for enrolment for Year 7 2021 at St Mary's Catholic College are required to attach all documents with the enrolment application, eg: birth, baptism, immunisation certificate. This information is stated on page 7 of the enrolment package.

Please note, while it is stated on page 7 of the Enrolment Package "Baptismal Certificate (if Catholic: not required if the student is enrolled in a diocesan school), St Mary's **DO** require the baptismal certificate to assist in prioritising the enrolment applications. They recognise that Baptismal Certificates accompany the students' files when they are delivered from our Primary Schools, however it is often well into term 1 of the following year before they receive these files.

Is the website safe?

Yes! Ultimate School has SSL certification and is fully PCI compliant which is used for all financial transactions conducted through our website. So what is PCI Compliant you may ask? PCI (The Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard) is a set of requirements designed to ensure that ALL companies that process credit card payments must maintain a secure environment.

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CARPARK RULES

All parents are required to follow the carpark rules:

No Parking in the the Kiss'n'drop zone

- "Kiss'n'drop" only operates in the morning, **NOT** in the afternoon
- Children should get out on the left side of the car. Parents should stay in the car.
- In the afternoon parents must park and walk to the gate to collect children
- No parking in the OOSH bus area
- No parking adjacent to the church, which is a walkway
- Avoid reversing when possible
- Drive at walking pace only
- Do not enter the staff parking section unless you have a 'disabled' sticker
- School zones remain in place for the safety of our children and families. School zones operate on all gazetted school days, which are all days the school is open, even pupil free days.
- Give way to all traffic as you exit the carpark.
